A Servant-Leadership Reflection Inspired by Joshua 1:9

The Verse

“Be strong and courageous... for the Lord your God will be with you wherever you go.”
– *Joshua 1:9*

Leadership Insight

Strength and courage are not personality traits. They are leadership postures. Joshua 1:9 reframes courage as obedience rather than confidence. Leaders move forward not because they feel ready, but because God goes with them.

Servant leadership begins with this conviction: **God’s presence is the leader’s greatest resource.**

Three Anchors for Servant Leaders

1. Courage is a calling, not a feeling

Fear doesn’t disqualify you. Waiting for certainty does. Leaders step into new assignments because God has already stepped into them first.

2. Strength comes from surrender

Biblical strength is not self-reliance. It’s God-dependence. The leader who kneels first stands strongest.

3. You are never sent alone

Every room, every decision, every transition, God is already there. Your leadership is not powered by your capacity but by His presence.

Application for Today’s Leader

- Step into the next assignment even if you feel unprepared.
- Lead with conviction rooted in God’s promises, not your comfort.
- Replace hesitation with obedience.

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- Let your courage be evidence of who walks with you.

- Where am I hesitating because I'm waiting to feel "ready"?
 - What would courage look like in my current season?
 - How does God's presence reshape the way I lead?
